

IN THE MATTER of an indictment in the Nova Scotia Supreme Court charging Glen Eugene Assoun with the second degree murder of Brenda Way on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1995;

AND IN THE MATTER of the conviction of Glen Eugene Assoun in the Nova Scotia Supreme Court for the second degree murder of Brenda Way on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September, 1999, and the sentence of life imprisonment thereafter imposed;

AND IN THE MATTER of an application for ministerial review of the said conviction of Glen Eugene Assoun pursuant to Part XXI.1 of the *Criminal Code of Canada*

**AFFIDAVIT OF KARLA LYNNE JINKERSON**

---

I, Karla Lynne Jinkerson, of the city of Calgary in the province of Alberta, hereby MAKE OATH AND SAY AS FOLLOWS:

**A. Biographical Information:**

1. I am 40 years old. My date of birth is September 8, 1970. I am currently married and have one child from my current marriage, a four year old boy.

**B. Background of relationships with Wayne Anthony Wise and Tina Cameron:**

(i) **Wayne Wise ("Wayne"):**

2. I was Wayne's girlfriend from about 1995 to 2000. I gave birth to our son Wayne Jr. on July 15, 1997.
3. During our relationship Wayne and I lived in various places across Canada. Wayne was not working and was committing criminal acts to support us during this time. Sometime in the fall of 1996 we moved to Dartmouth Nova Scotia where Wayne continued to commit criminal acts to support me and his ongoing crack cocaine addiction.
4. We lived in a number of different places in Dartmouth. First I think we stayed with Wayne's family and then sometime in January 1997 we moved into a hotel in Dartmouth.
5. Sometime in January or February of 1997 Wayne was arrested and taken into police custody for cheque fraud. Shortly after his arrest he called me from jail and told me that the police had offered him a deal to shorten the amount of time that he would have to spend in jail if he told them that his Uncle Glen had confessed to murder during a telephone conversation that the two of them had.
6. This was the first time that Wayne told me about a conversation with his Uncle Glen and the first time he suggested Glen had confessed to murdering Brenda Way. I had spent a great deal of time with Wayne in the period before he was arrested and I had never heard him suggest that Glen Assoun had anything to do with the murder, which was a topic of conversation in Wayne's family at that time. I asked Wayne why his uncle would kill this woman and he said that he killed her because she cheated on him. At the end of our conversation I told Wayne that if that was the truth then he should tell the police.

7. Wayne gave the police a statement and in return he told me that he received less time on the charges that he was facing. In return the police also helped me to get an apartment at 92 Gaston Road in Dartmouth. I can't remember specifically whether the police helped me with the rent or damage deposit or just called the landlord to arrange for the apartment. Detective MacDonald also promised a new life in another province for us.
8. I was picked up by the police and brought to the police station on the day that Wayne gave his statement. When I arrived at the police station I remember the police let me sit with Wayne in one of the small rooms and talk with him alone. Wayne knew that the police wanted me to give them a statement as well and he was telling me what I should say and how I should say it in my statement. I can't remember exactly what Wayne was telling me; however, I remember that he was concerned about what I was going to say and how I was going to say it.
9. I gave the police a written statement on that day at the police department. It was the only statement that I gave the police in this case. I remember that I described the first phone call that Wayne made to me when he told me that he was offered a deal by the police if he agreed to give a statement about the phone call that he had with his uncle Glen. When I gave the statement I think the grey haired detective, Detective MacDonald was the police officer who was in the room with me.
10. After Wayne and I gave statements the police helped me to move out of the shelter that I moved into after Wayne was arrested and into 92 Gaston Road. I lived for a short time in a bachelor apartment in 92 Gaston Road, then shortly afterwards I moved into a one bedroom.
11. After I moved into 92 Gaston Road the police kept in pretty regular touch with me. I remember Detective MacDonald and his partner driving me to the Halifax County

Correctional Centre to visit Wayne.

**(ii) Tina Cameron**

12. I met Tina Cameron ("Tina") sometime after Wayne and I moved to Dartmouth in 1996. I found out that Tina worked as an escort. I remember Wayne and myself and Tina being together although I can't remember exactly where that was. I just know it was after we moved to Dartmouth.
13. Tina lived in the same apartment building at 92 Gaston Road that the police helped me move into. I can't remember if she was there before I moved in or whether she moved in after me. I do remember that Tina and I used to spend a lot of time together. I didn't know anybody in Nova Scotia and she used to come to my apartment at least once a day to say hi and spend time with me.
14. One day when Tina and I were talking at my apartment I told her that Wayne had given a statement to the police in a case involving the murder of a prostitute that his uncle went out with. Tina said she knew the family of the murder victim and was told that Wayne's uncle Glen used to beat her. She did not say anything to suggest that she knew the uncle was guilty or that she had heard him confess to the murder.
15. Sometime after I told Tina about Wayne's involvement in the murder investigation, Wayne called my apartment when Tina was there. During my conversation with Wayne I told him that I had told Tina about him helping the police in the murder case. Wayne was upset and asked me to give the phone to Tina so he could speak to her so I gave the phone to Tina.
16. I heard Tina and Wayne talking about the murder and the police investigation. I remember Tina telling Wayne that she knew the family and that Glen was a prick to


the dead woman and used to beat her. From what I could hear, it appeared that Wayne was trying to convince Tina to go and speak to the police and to give them a statement. They also discussed the things that the police were doing for Wayne and the things that they had promised Wayne. I did not hear Tina say, during this conversation, or ever, that Tina heard Glen Assoun confess to murder.


17. After the call with Wayne, Tina and I talked about the promises that the police had given Wayne. We talked about Wayne's sentence being reduced and that the police were telling him that they were going to fly Wayne and I out of Nova Scotia and get us a house to live in far away in a place where we could be safe and raise our baby.

18. Tina told me that she was not going to testify in a case for free and that she was also going to try and get something in return.

19. I have been told that Tina said that she went with me to the police station and when we arrived Tina found out that I was there to speak to the police about this murder and as a result she decided to tell the police what she knew about the murder as well. This is not true. I never went to the police station with Tina. The only time that I was with Tina and the police was when they drove Tina and me to the Halifax County Correctional Centre so that I could visit Wayne and Tina could see a friend that she had in jail at the time.
