- the need for any further treatment or the expectation that you will receive further treatment; and
- any permanent or long-term disability.

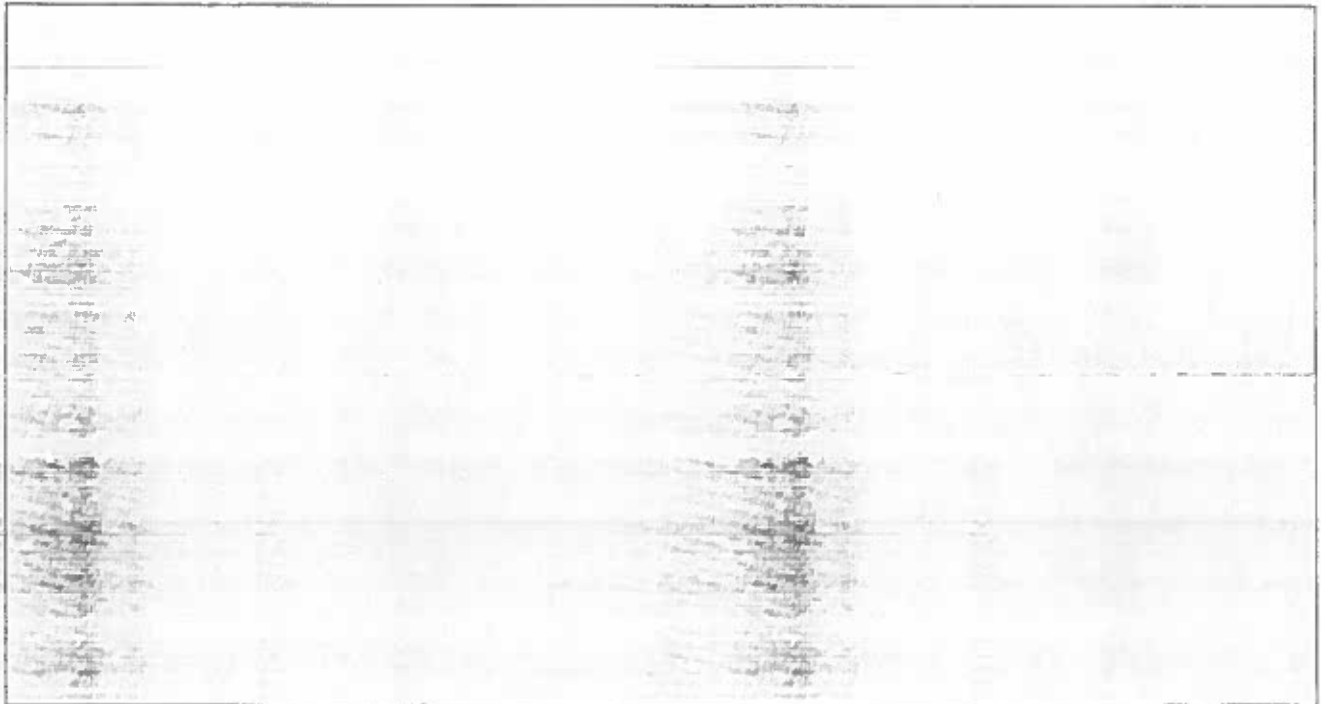

I am glad to have the opportunity to speak here today of my brother, Corey James Leslie Rogers, to lend voice to his life; his story, his legacy. From his sudden, preventable passing, throughout all of these proceedings, my family and I are most thankful for our relatives and close friends, who have been ever supportive and bouyant to our spirits.

I count myself one of the luckiest people to have been able to spend time growing alongside this brilliant, funny, thoughtful and truly kind person. We do not understand what life is now without him in our world. We do not understand how he has gone; and, we are broken – how can this be real?

He was some of my mother's finest work; a list of adjectives do not do him justice.

### EMOTIONAL IMPACT

The cliches about moments like this are, as it turns out, all too true. The one about life forever changing in a split second, the fact that we are all bound up in a web of love and loss, about the primacy of community in times of unfathomable tragedy.

For me, it has been a daily struggle not to fall into a deep depression. My family has been haunted since June 16, 2019 with the knowledge and memory of what Cheryl Gardner and Dan Fraser have done. Corey's life was not for either of them to have taken away. Cheryl Gardner and Dan Fraser showed a callous disregard for the value of Corey's life. Even today, in the face of overwhelming pain, loss and grief – neither Cheryl Gardner or Dan Fraser have shown remorse or accountability for their crime.

I have been numb. I have cried sobs, suddenly collecting myself because my emotions had no known path to follow. Never having had a roommate or close friend pass, this is my first experience in dealing with a loss of this magnitude – and I was not prepared for Corey's unnecessary departure from my life. I have never known anyone quite like him.

I have tried, in my way, to make some sense of all of this – and cannot. The loss of my brother is beyond tragic and incomprehensible. I will love Corey and continue to cherish our time spent together. He grew with me from my first memories into manhood; for those around him he made the world a better and more humourous place.
